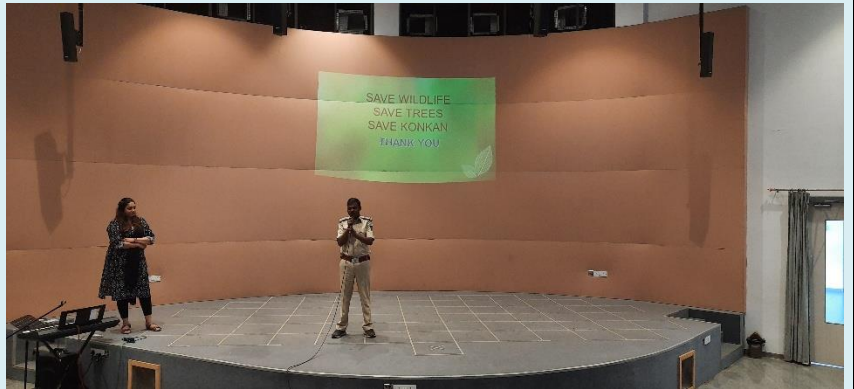

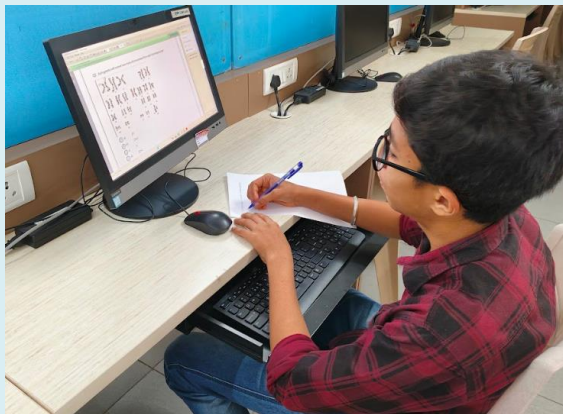

Clubs for AY 2024-2025:

In the beginning of the academic year, SVM announced the formation of the following Clubs and invited the learners from Grades 1 to 8 to be a part of the same.

- **The Dance Club** - The Dance Club serves as a vibrant platform for students passionate about movement and expression. It is dedicated to nurturing talent, refining technique, and expanding versatility across diverse dance genres. Through regular practice sessions and performance opportunities, the club not only hones members' choreography and rhythm but also significantly enhances their stage presence and confidence. It is a space where creativity meets discipline, enabling learners to explore the art of dance in its many forms.
- **The Art Club** – This Club provides learners with continuous, hands-on exposure to both traditional and modern art practices. Students get to explore a variety of painting styles, ranging from folk to contemporary, while learning about renowned Indian and international artists. They are also get to visit art exhibitions in town and beyond, gaining valuable real-world insights into the world of curated art. In parallel, we prepare them diligently for the Elementary and Intermediate Art Examinations, focusing on refining techniques and building their portfolios.
- **The Music Club** - The Music Club is concerned with nurturing a deep engagement with sound and rhythm as learners are actively learning to play instruments such as the guitar, keyboard, and drums. They listen and exploring a wide range of musical genres, allowing them to develop a nuanced appreciation for music and the diverse cultures from which it originates. Through regular sessions, they are deepening their understanding of musical traditions while also honing their technical skills. The club is also providing ample opportunities for learners to showcase their talent through live performances, encouraging confidence and expressive freedom on stage.
- **The General Knowledge Club** – This Club actively engages learners in expanding their awareness across a wide spectrum of topics through theme-based quizzes and interactive discussions. Participants are delving into subjects such as automobiles, sports, and current affairs, sharpening their critical thinking and recall abilities. By exploring these diverse themes, learners strengthen their factual knowledge while also developing curiosity, confidence, and a broader understanding of the world around them.
- **The Theatre Club** - The Theatre Club introduces learners to the essential elements of stagecraft. They learn about stage protocol, techniques for effective voice projection, and ways to enhance their physical presence during performances. Through regular practice and guidance, students develop confidence, expressiveness, and a strong command of the stage. The club nurtures not only performance skills but also collaboration, empathy, and a deeper appreciation for the art of theatre.
- **The Vedic Math Club** - The Vedic Math Club offers learners a dynamic space to strengthen their numerical abilities and logical reasoning. Students prepare for various competitive Olympiads and mathematics exams, gaining exposure to problem-solving under timed conditions. They learn mathematics through both abacus techniques and ancient Vedic methods, which promote mental agility, accuracy, and speed. The club helps demystify complex calculations, making math enjoyable and accessible while building a solid foundation for future academic pursuits.
- **The Grow and Cook Club** - The Grow and Cook Club empowers learners with practical knowledge of sustainable living and ecological responsibility. They explore native plants and soil types, and deepen their understanding of medicinal and spice plants. The club introduces the complete process of growing organic vegetables and grains - from selecting seeds to nurturing plants for self-consumption.



Students prepare organic manure and learn basic treatments for plant diseases and fungal infections. They also experiment with solar cooking, emphasizing energy-efficient practices. The club manages a seed bank and engages in harvesting, processing, packaging, and selling of produce, fostering entrepreneurial skills. Concepts like hydroponics, drip irrigation systems, and rainwater harvesting are also explored, encouraging learners to think innovatively about future-ready farming and water conservation.

- **The Mass Media and Communication Club** - The Mass Media and Communication Club plays a vital role in documenting and showcasing the school's literary and cultural achievements. The club is responsible for curating content for school publications, including annual journals, newsletters, and magazines. Members actively engage in reporting events, conducting interviews, and refining their writing and editorial skills. Through this, learners cultivate a strong sense of voice, clarity in communication, and a deeper appreciation for the power of media in shaping narratives.
- **The Robotics and Cyber Club** - The Robotics and Cyber Club serves as a dynamic hub for innovation, where learners explore the interconnected worlds of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. The club covers a wide spectrum of domains; from mechanical design and electronic circuitry to computer programming and automation. It encourages hands-on learning through building robots, coding solutions, and engaging with real-world technological challenges. As an all-encompassing STEM platform, the club fosters critical thinking, creativity, and collaboration, equipping students with future-ready skills in an increasingly digital world.
- **The Pathfinders' Club** - The Pathfinders' Club is thoughtfully designed for the youngest learners of Grades 1 and 2, offering them a dedicated space for exploration, creativity, and growth. With a focus on experiential learning, facilitators curate and conduct a variety of age-appropriate activities that spark curiosity, nurture imagination, and build foundational skills. The club provides a joyful and stimulating environment where children actively engage in hands-on experiences, setting the stage for a lifelong love of learning.

Houses at SVM

At Sarvankash Vidya Mandir, the House system forms a vital thread in the fabric of school life - four Houses standing as pillars of spirited participation, camaraderie, and healthy competition. Overseeing the functioning of these Houses is the Student Council, a hallmark of student leadership and democratic values within the school. As the academic year 2024–25 commenced, learners from Grades 7 to 10 were invited to participate in a robust and transparent election process. Approximately thirty-eight enthusiastic candidates campaigned for fourteen leadership positions within the Council, including Head Girl and Head Boy, House Captains, Vice-Captains, and House Ministers.

Their spirited addresses during the special assembly were met with equal enthusiasm from voters across Grades 1 to 10, who exercised their franchise in a well-conducted secret ballot.
