GROW & COOK CLUB:

Through our CLUB activities at SVM we wish to develop the “planting habit” in the new generation and create a lifetime of interest towards agriculture and the environment.





MASS MEDIA & COMMUNICATION CLUB:

The Mass Media and Communication Club at SVM conducted many activities during the academic year 2022/23 that catered to the needs of learners from different age groups. The activities included Logo Designing, Role Plays, writing Book and Movie Reviews, Slogan Writing, Interviews, Story Telling, etc. The sole purpose of these activities was to scaffold the learners in the initial stage and help them hone their potential skills because we believe in the holistic development of learners and such opportunities, which we feel are crucial at this age. STEM CLUB:

The STEM club had maximum number of learners. Our curious and little scientists began experimenting on various topics from day 1. Some of the activities were:

Constellation activity:

There is always something new to be seen in the unchanging sky. The most beautiful prominent and recognizable are constellations in the night sky. As part of experiential learning, the members of the STEM Club participated in hands-on activities by preparing their own constellations and decorated them with lights. Learning about constellations opened the possibilities for discussions about science, religion and birth-stars. Learners enjoyed the process of making the Great Bear, Hunter constellations and attempted to identify their own birth-stars (Janma-nakshatra) and what it resembles. Recognizing patterns and shapes are the basic math skills that were embedded as skill activity.

Microscope Observation:

Through the microscope, the teeny-tiny wonders of nature can be seen i.e., visualizing things that are otherwise invisible to the naked eye. As part of experiential learning, STEM members prepared their microscopic slides using the material “Rhizopus” and “Onion peel”. The learners were excited to observe the cells under the microscope.

Circuits:

As part of STEM activity, “circuit making” helped students get hands-on building, testing experience and a view to exploring the science of circuits. STEM members were amazed to know how the flow of current takes place, how circuits break, why the bulb wasn’t glowing. The most fun activity we undertook was making a series circuit with bulbs and decorating them for Diwali celebrations.



MODEL UNITED NATIONS:

With just six learners opting for the Model United Nations Club initiated in 2020-21, SVM embarked on a journey to explore the realms of international affairs, ties and multilateral negotiations. The year started with a set agenda to hold the maiden SVM MUN in the premise to offer an opportunity to our young think tanks. The year 2022-23 saw learners as young as from grade 1 showing grave interested in the issues like, world inflation, Vaccine drive, Covid recovery and henceforth. So during the Term 1, the club focused on newspaper reading, researching and oratory refinement sessions.

After the tedious interactions between the SVM MUNNERS in the previous term, the layout for the maiden SVM MUN 2022-2023. Pressing hard on the Russo-Ukraine war and its perilous effects, the Club members comprising grade 10 as chairing committee while grade 6 to grade 9 learners participating as delegates of various nations chose the agendas to be taken up for various committees like DISEC, Administrative and Budgetary etc. based on the need to end the war scenario and cater to the global food and economic crisis that awaits the turn of the year.

This first in-house MUN conference, intrinsically designed by the learners of grade 10 Ekam, gave an opportunity to unearth the latent leadership, coordinating skills and collaborative traits of our learners. Children took turns in drafting their introductory speeches, analyzing and reassessing the pointers that could make their delegation effective. International affairs were moderated and heatedly discussed to understand the stance of a particular country from another continent in context of the war wagging between Russia and Ukraine.

Various stages of roll calls, agenda decision, speakers list, moderated caucus, unmoderated caucus, drafting of white papers and voting for the motion saw the club buzzing and busy all the time. The SVM MUN scheduled on 29th Jan 2023 has its complete hard work and research work on display. There has also been a separate Press and Media coverage committee that had worked in close aid with the development of logos, video clips and all the paparazzi during the dry rehearsals of the conference. We pray for the success and multiple MUN seminars in future.





Houses at SVM

And so it is in the framework of a school, wherein exists the system of Houses, four to be mathematically precise. At the head of the Houses stands the Student Council, a fine example of which, can be found at Sarvankash Vidya Mandir. At the beginning of the academic year 2022-23, learners from the Grades of 6 to 9 were encouraged to contend in what would later be, a superblyexecuted unbiased, democratic election. Around thirty-eight students applied for the available fourteen posts in the Student Council, comprising of the Head-Girl and Boy, four House Captains, four House Vice-Captains and four House Ministers. While the incumbents made their intentions known in public assembly, the voters (Grades 1 to 10) did a fine job of selecting the candidates of their choice. No sooner was the new Student Council installed, that it began working diligently towards the maintenance of discipline and everyday school decorum. It is as if, they had taken over the ownership of certain aspects within the school. As for the rivalry between Houses, it was conducted in the healthiest of ways with the House Masters taking charge of their respective Houses and egging on their House members to participate in day to day activities and events so as to garner laurels and points for their Houses. The point system kept the House members on their toes; especially after the lull created by the pandemic, the excitement to participate and win was doubly strong.

The first event in the academic year was the Sports Quiz which saw action between the Houses. Held at two different levels, we had separate quizzes happening simultaneously for Grades 2 to 5 and 6 to 10 respectively. The quiz for Grades 2 to 5 was won by the Yellow House (Leo), while in the quiz for Grades 6 to 10, the Blue House (Gaganyaan) got its first taste of victory.

Ten days later, we had a Chess competition held across grades. Once again, many of us were left open-mouthed with the favourites going down to opponents who were least expected to cause a stir. All in all, the Chess contest was a rousing hit and a continuous source of points for all four Houses on account of mass participation.

We were still in July when, the Mangrove Cell of Ratnagiri organized a painting competition aimed at increasing the awareness about mangroves. This time round we had quite a few learners that participated and whose work was adjudged by the local Mangrove Cell coordinators.

Subsequently, during one of our morning assemblies, amidst much fanfare, the District Forest Warden himself, felicitated the winners of the painting contest. As we gently slid into August, the month of India's Independence, the Houses got busy adorning their House soft-boards with themes of Patriotism and India's Azadi ka Amritmahotsav. In the end, we had a clear winner in the race for the best soft-board. It was none other than the Green House, staying true to their symbol – Phoenix, rising like an eagle from the embers to soar into the endless sky. Consequently, with Independence Day nearly at hand, we also had Singing and Elocution contests held under the banner of "Har Ghar Tiranga". The Singing competition saw grade-wise choral participation from Grades 5 to 8. Around twenty-one learners participated in the Elocution contest, dishing out speeches in a tri-colour of languages, these being Hindi, Marathi and English. This was just the beginning of the year, we looked forward to great challenges and duels to be had between the Houses, all in good spirit though.

The month of September 2022 was a super-charged period of infinite proportions. Now, although the 3rd week was to be celebrated as "Literary week" with contests galore, preparations began as soon as school commenced post the Ganeshotsav break. The first leg of competitions was kicked off with the soft-board challenge based on language and literary works. The competition was a close one, the top prize was eventually bagged by the Green House. The gala event covering literary week



was aptly named, “Shabdavali” and it consisted of a long list of contests set to be undertaken during the aforementioned week. Led by the facilitators of the “Languages dept.”, there were a total of twenty-six or more contests held all through the week, averaging four to five events on a single day alone. This was by no means an easy feat. Shabdavali was brought to a grand closure with a day-long program on October 1, 2022, which saw participation from three to four schools from Ratnagiri; the highlight of the event being the interpretation of two Shakespearean plays by the students of M. S. Naik School and our very own SVM. In the end, it was the all-girl outfit of M. S. Naik School that won the trophy hands-down for their inimitable rendition of the court scene from “The Merchant of Venice.” Fresh from the rigours of the literary week, October passed by rather quietly.

The Diwali break soon followed and school resumed in the first week of November. The Sports department organized a badminton tournament for learners right from Grades 2 to 10. Here was another opportunity to gather points for their respective Houses. The rivalries between Houses had become fiercer since the gains/ losses of Shabdavali. It is worth noting that by now, there was a stalemate brewing between the Blue and Green Houses, each vying for the highest position. November also saw a few of our learners participate in contests outside SVM, who won accolades for themselves and SVM. We are proud to mention the names of Ms. Geet Gawankar, Mst. Dhananjay Ghosale, Mst. Samar Salvi, Ms. Sejal Pednekar and Ms. Aarya Karkare who represented SVM and returned victorious in their respective categories. Come December, the month designated for sports, the kids geared up for newer challenges.

After life was brought to a standstill a few years ago, it felt great to have the kids back on the outfield, ready for some real sport contests. The first week in December saw the learners practice for every event lined up for the Annual Sports Day, scheduled to be held on December 17, 2022. The second week was committed to completing the heats for every event so that the finals for the same could be seen through on the assigned date. On the actual day of the event, the atmosphere in the school was one of anticipation and restlessness. The energy was high and the contestants raring to go, seeking nothing but victory. The Annual Sports Day began with a “Torch run” with the original “Freedom Run” song from 1987 playing in the background, t’was quite a nostalgic moment for many of us. No sooner did the events commence, the roars from the audience kept getting louder and louder. The scoreboard kept fluctuating with points being updated every half hour, with the Blue and Green Houses offering stiff competition. However, the efforts of the Green House prevailed the Sports Trophy was theirs at the end of the day. While the Green House members were ecstatic, the House Master herself was beaming with pride at the achievement.

The month of January 2023 saw the learners get back to their books with a renewed vigour, which was of course followed by the periodical examinations. Now, the closing ceremony for the Houses and Clubs was projected for the end of January, however, a visit by our school consultant Ms. Fatema Agarkar (ACE, Mumbai), slated for early February coincided with our plans and finally, a mega-event was held in her presence on February 4, 2023. The event as expected was a hit, with every Club putting up a spectacular performance based on the years’ activities.

And then, amidst much anticipation and fanfare, with a mention of the points earned, the Blue House was named, House of the Year, bagging the Cup for a second year running. But, this wasn’t achieved easily, since the Green House was close on the heels of the Blue House throughout the year and on occasion held the lead for a while.

We now look forward to the academic year 2023-24 and wait patiently as the days grow closer and it’s time to repeat the cycle with a new Student Council, Houses, Club formation, contests, winning-losing, the joy and regret... all in the name of healthy competition and sportsman’s spirit.

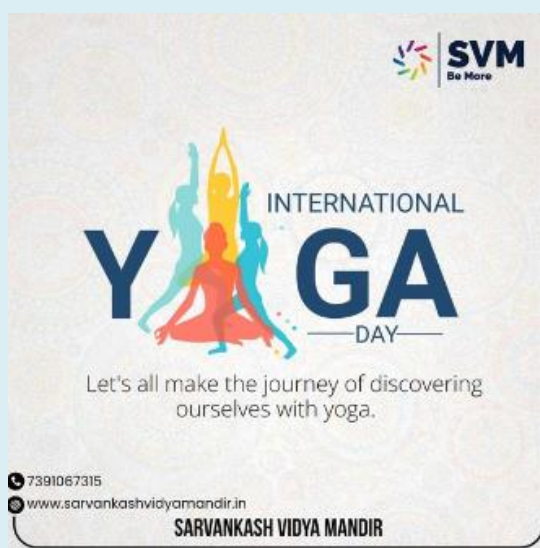
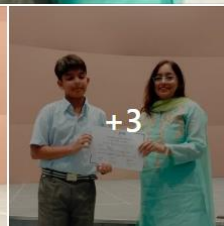

Field Trips

Visit to Coast Guard (Nursery to Grade 2)
